## 160MB 5.25-inch HDA: How to Change SCSI ID (3/93)

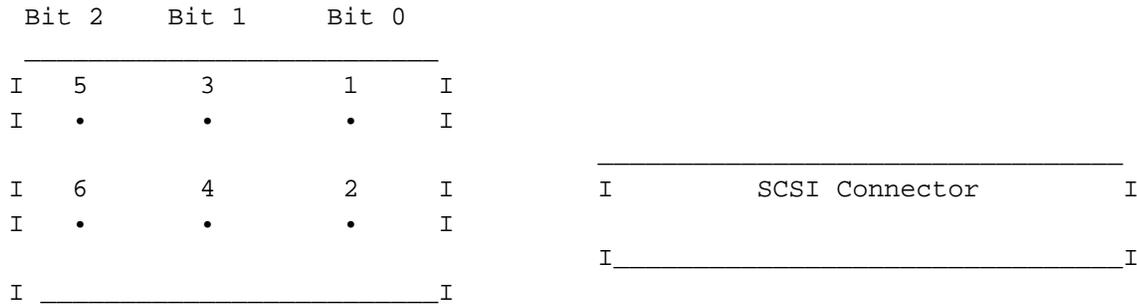
### TOPIC -----

How do I manually reconfigure the SCSI address of the CDC 160MB 5.25-inch hard drive, and what jumper settings are needed?

### DISCUSSION -----

The SCSI Device Select Connector is a 6-pin male connector located next to the SCSI connector and is contained within the connector envelope on the CDC 160MB drive.

The SCSI ID can be set by jumpering the pins in the following way:



| ID # | Bit 2    | Bit 1    | Bit 0    |
|------|----------|----------|----------|
| 0    | None     | None     | None     |
| 1    | Jumpered | None     | None     |
| 2    | None     | Jumpered | None     |
| 3    | Jumpered | Jumpered | None     |
| 4    | None     | None     | Jumpered |
| 5    | Jumpered | None     | Jumpered |
| 6    | None     | Jumpered | Jumpered |
| 7    | Jumpered | Jumpered | Jumpered |

It is important to note that Apple has shipped three different CDC/Seagate/Imprimis models of the 160MB drive. Each drive should be used in the configuration for which it was intended.

| Service P/N            | Seagate (CDC/Imprimis) P/N | System                    |
|------------------------|----------------------------|---------------------------|
| 661-0601<br>(internal) | 77748206 (Internal drive)  | Macintosh II/IIX          |
| 661-1640               | 77748240 (Internal drive)  | Macintosh IIfx (internal) |
| 661-0584               | 77748226 (External drive ) | External drive only       |

- 661-0601 is for use internally with the Macintosh II and IIX . This drive is not forward compatible and SHOULD NOT be used in the External 160SC or the Macintosh IIfx.
- 661-1640 is for use internally in the Macintosh IIfx, however, IT IS backward compatible and can be used in the Macintosh II and IIX and external 160SC.
- 661-0584 is for use in the external 160SC. This drive is not forward compatible and SHOULD NOT be used in the Macintosh II, IIX, or IIfx.

Again it is important to use and/or order the correct part for the corresponding Macintosh System. Apple drives are not to be used in systems other than what they were originally intended for.
