DAL: Need Select Privilege for Insert or Update

TOPIC -----

Here is a short description of the error case we encountered that prompted us to ask for the DAL to DB2 SQL mapping.

- 1) For a user with insert or update privileges, but not the select privilege on a table. The following error occurs when inserting on the table, using DAL on DAL Terminal.

The trace on the mainframe shows that the first SQL statement executed in DB2 is a SELECT.

- 2) When the user is granted select privilege, the error disappears.
- 3) The error only occurs when the insert or update is done on the DAL Terminal or HyperCard using DAL. Users can insert or update on the table on the mainframe using DB2 SQL.
- 4) When the user is granted the select privilege and then the privilege is revoked, the error disappears.

We are using v1.3.5f1 of the MVS/VTAM server.

DISCUSSION -----

As part of its architecture, DAL does a select to verify the row names in the table prior to doing an insert. This hasn't been a problem to other customers. We don't understand why you grant update and insert capabilities, but not select to some users. These users have no way to verify that the insert or update took place correctly.

Here is a workaround. Use the "EXECUTE IN..." statement, and do the insert directly (that is, bypassing DAL). You won't be able to verify the insert, and you can't verify it with their security profile. So, the functionality should be identical.
