LaserWriter IINTX-A: Printing Kanji

TOPIC -----

Please compare the LaserWriter IINTX-A to the LaserWriter IINTX-J. In particular, can the LaserWriter IINTX-A totally replace the LaserWriter IINTX-J when printing Kanji documents?

DISCUSSION -----

Both printers use the same controller board. The LaserWriter IINTX-A comes with the Chinese Fonts hard disk and the IINTX-J comes with the Japanese Fonts hard disk. You can print Kanji on the IINTX-A if you have the Kanji Fonts disk.

Theoretically, you should be able to daisy chain the two hard disks, but we've heard there's a bug that prevents this. Also, you can't buy the NTX-J font disk separately.

The other problem you might run into is obtaining the Kanji fonts, since we believe you can only get them with the controller board. Assuming you can get the fonts, you have the following options:

- Swap the fonts disk.
- Get a larger hard drive and store both Chinese and Japanese fonts on it.
