How do I add PostScript to a LaserWriter Select 300? What abilities do I gain or lose if I add PostScript?

DISCUSSION -----

Adding PostScript

-----  
You can add PostScript to your LaserWriter Select 300 by installing the Apple LaserWriter Select 300 PostScript Option. This is a logic board exchange that effectively changes your printer to a LaserWriter Select 310.

Because some disassembly is required, this expansion kit must be installed by an authorized Apple dealer. If you want to keep both logic boards, and switch between them, you must have a dealer perform the logic board switch each time.

What You Gain, What You Lose

-----  
When you add the PostScript Option to a LaserWriter Select 300, you add the ability to print PostScript Level I documents, but you lose the FinePrint and PhotoGrade image enhancement technologies, as well as printer sharing.

Also, you cannot use memory from the original LaserWriter Select 300 logic board on the logic board contained in the PostScript Option, because the SIMMs are different sizes. If you wish to add printer memory when installing the PostScript Option, you must use the 1MB or 4MB 72-pin SIMMs for the LaserWriter Select 310.
